### Medical needs of students

Please note, Anaphylaxis Action Plans need to be in colour, on the most recent form provided by ASCIA (currently 2022), dated 2022/2023 by a doctor and include a colour photo of your child.

Thank you to parents who have already visited the office with an updated Health Plan and Action Plan this year. Please also ensure that your child's medication is current.

If you have not yet visited the office to provide your child's health care plan, action plan and check that their medication is current, please do so as soon as possible. Some forms were sent home at the end of 2021, as they were due to expire.

Last Thursday we held our annual Swimming Carnival. Thank you to Miss Nicolopoulos and Mr Culkin for their wonderful organisation of a very successful carnival and to our staff for providing support to ensure the carnival's smooth running. # COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE



Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

### What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards for homeschooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

### The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time

- ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
  - helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
  - gives students time to greet their friends before class
  - reduces classroom disruption.
- Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

### What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance e.g. attending a funeral.

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 7 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

### Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 30 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

# MORNING DROP OFF AND AFTERNOON PICK UP

If you have any questions, please contact our school office.

Active supervision is an essential element of our duty of care obligations. Teachers are on duty from 8:30 am each morning. Students should arrive at their designated time however, in circumstances where students arrive before their designated time, there will be a teacher on duty from 8:30 am providing supervision for students and ensuring they remain in their cohort. Students are not permitted to play on school grounds before this time. Please contact our school office to enquire about before and after school care if you require supervision for your child outside school hours.

These procedures will continue until we receive further advice from the Department of Education.

# SENTRAL FOR PARENTS' PORTAL

At the end of 2021 school year, all families received a letter regarding Sentral, our new platform used to communicate with parents. This letter was handed to students and contained your family's unique access key to use when accessing the Sentral for Parents app.

The Sentral for Parents Portal will replace Schoolzine from 1 April, 2022 and parents are asked to download the app in preparation for the changeover.

## The Sentral for Parents app allows families to:

- explain past and upcoming student absences
- receive sick bay notifications
- receive real-time notifications and messages from the school
- view academic reports
- view calendar events
- view school documents
- view school newsletters
- view links to URL's provided by the school
- book parent/teacher interviews

3. Click Register here to register a new account.

You will receive a verification email which **MUST** be verified in order to continue.

### Quality Work by 6J

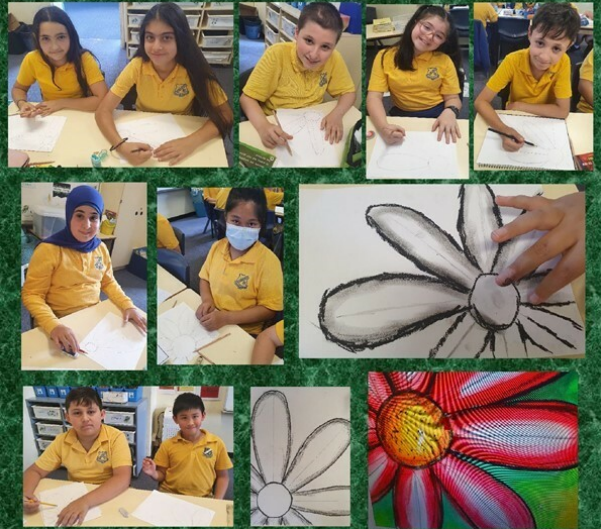
Albert Einstein once said "Creativity is contagious, pass it on".

# CANTEEN NEWS

## Welcome to the Kingsgrove Public School Canteen

Welcome back to our wonderful school community, we cannot wait to see all your children's smiling faces back at school, we hope everyone enjoyed the school holidays as much as possible during these very difficult times.

So now that the children will all be back at school on Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> the canteen will also be operating for lunch orders and to make purchases over the counter at recess and lunch whilst still following the COVID safe guidelines. Our lunch ordering system is still the same as last year with the following two options available.

### Lunch Ordering Options

The following are 2 different options you have so you can start ordering your children's healthy lunch orders at the Kingsgrove Public School canteen. If you have any questions in regards to any of the below options please don't hesitate to contact our staff on Ph. 9510 9097 and ask to be transferred to the canteen. If you have an existing account at our canteen your canteen credit is still active so no need to open up another account, if you would like to open an account, please don't hesitate to contact the staff at the canteen who will assist you in regards to opening an account. **Previously our canteen had online ordering system with a company called MY KIDS LUNCHBOX online ordering this company has now ceased trading, so anyone who had accounts with this company are asked not to place lunch orders with this company.** All canteen accounts will now be directly with the canteen at the school, for more information please don't hesitate to contact our staff directly.

**Option 1.** Children can place lunch orders at the canteen in the morning's by writing out their own lunch order and paying over the counter by cash, we supply lunch bags free of charge, or they can bring their lunch order from home with their name, class and money in an envelope or in their own lunch bags. Children can also make purchases at breakfast, recess and lunch with cash.

**Option 2.** Parents and Carers can set up a canteen account, which is totally free of any charges, we do not charge credit card fees or set up fees for your canteen account. The account gets set up by cash or credit card deposit with a minimum of \$50.00 as an opening balance under your children's surname and class, your child will also be able to make purchases over the counter at breakfast, recess and lunch if you wish them too, otherwise we can make a note on their accounts that they are not to make purchases over the counter and the account is only for placing lunch orders.

When your credit balance gets below \$10.00 you will receive a sms to your mobile that your account is running low and top will automatically be done with the credit card details on our system, you will also receive weekly account balances sent to your mobile so you can keep track.

**Please note that the canteen will no longer accept lunch orders without payment or your canteen account in credit and all lunch orders need to be placed by 9.30 each morning.**

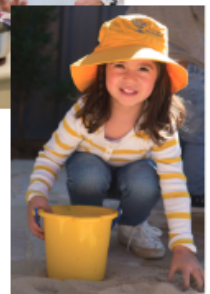

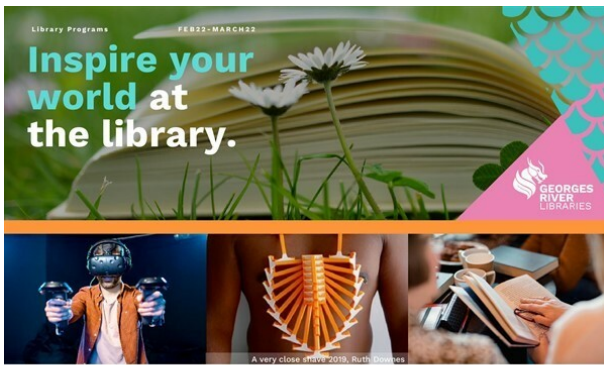

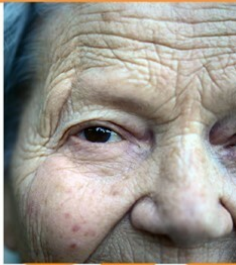
