Parent Teacher Interviews Term 1

We will be conducting Parent Teacher Interviews in week 10 commencing Monday, 28 March to Friday, 1 April 2022. Parents and carers will have the opportunity to book a face-to-face or telephone interview. All interviews will run for 10 minutes and provide an opportunity for your child's teacher to discuss your child's progress at school in Term 1. Students who are supported with a Personalised Learning and Support Plan (PLSP) will have a 15-minute interview to allow time for parents and teachers to discuss the PLSP goals.

Parent Teacher Interviews for students in our Support Classes will be held in week 11 from Monday, 4 April. Information will be sent to families next week.

Tell Them From Me Survey

Next week, students in Years 4-6 will participate in the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

Tell Them From Me is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

The survey is strictly confidential which means teachers won't know how students have answered. It is conducted online and takes about 30 minutes to complete. The survey will be administered during school hours and participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form for parents and carers has been sent home. If you do not wish your child/children to participate, please return the form to school.

NAPLAN Practice Test

Next week, Years 3 and 5 students will participate in a NAPLAN Practice Test. The purpose of this is to familiarise students with the online platform. The results will not be recorded as an assessment and teachers will be able to assist students in order to build their confidence in preparation for the online NAPLAN assessments in Term 2.

The NAPLAN Practice Test includes three online assessment components:

Year 3: Omnibus test (45 min reading, language of convention and numeracy).

Year 5: Omnibus test (45 min reading, language of convention, numeracy and 42 min writing).

The assessment is scheduled for Year 3 students on **Tuesday, 22 March**.

The assessment is scheduled for Year 5 students on **Tuesday, 22 March and Thursday, 24 March**.

We request that all Years 3 and 5 students ensure they have brought in headphones clearly labelled with their name and class before the day of their assessment.

Years 4 and 6 Check-in Assessments

During week 10 from Monday, 28 March to Friday, 1 April students in Years 4 and 6 will participate in a reading and numeracy Check-in assessment. The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment which supports schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The Check-in assessments supplement our existing school assessments in identifying how students are performing in reading and numeracy. The results will be used formatively by the teachers as they will help to inform our next steps so that curriculum delivery and teaching and learning is targeted and responsive to student needs.

A separate note will be sent home with further information.

Changes to Self-isolation and Close Contact Requirements

A recent change to the Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order 2022 (PDF), has meant the following amendments are now relevant to our schools.

- A household contact will only need to self-isolate for 7 days commencing from when the diagnosed person took the test, rather than 7 days from last contact with the diagnosed person.
- A household contact is not obligated to self-isolate as a contact more than once in a 21-day period (if the person is diagnosed with COVID-19, they will need to self-isolate again).
- A person who had COVID-19 and later becomes a close contact or household contact does not need to self-isolate as a contact if it has been less than 8 weeks since the person finished their self-isolation period (up from 28 days in the current Order).

Please note that we have been experiencing a rise in the number of confirmed COVID positive cases at school over the past few weeks. We ask that you continue to monitor your child for symptoms and continue to use Rapid Antigen testing regularly.

Positive Covid cases should be reported to school as well as through the Service NSW website or Service NSW app.

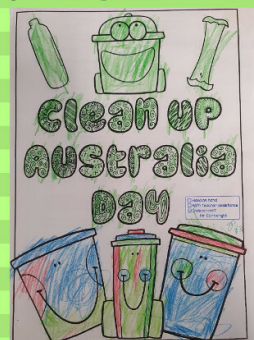

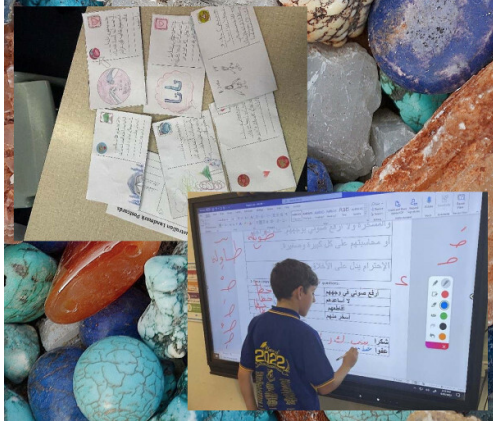
Arabic Language Classes at Kingsgrove Public School

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REMINDER STUDENT INJURY INSURANCE

The Department of Education **does not** provide accident or medical insurance cover for students on school grounds.

Kingsgrove Public School P&C Association is organising student injury insurance cover for our students.

The Student Injury Policy provides cover for students in the event of an injury or accident, and a wide range of benefits are covered 24 hours a day, seven days a week, Australia wide.

All claims processed will incur a \$50 excess fee. This fee is deducted from the total awarded. The P & C can be contacted about the insurance policy or to obtain a copy.

The cost is \$5.00 for each child to enable all students to be covered by this policy.

Please forward a **\$5.00 cash** payment for each child (in an envelope labelled with your child/children's name and class) to their class teacher by **Friday, 25 March**. Please note: **CASH ONLY - POP payments will not be accepted**.

SENTRAL FOR PARENTS' PORTAL

At the end of 2021 school year, all families received a letter regarding Sentral, our new platform used to communicate with parents. This letter was handed to students and contained your family's unique access key to use when accessing the Sentral for Parents app.

The Sentral for Parents Portal will replace Schoolzine from 1 April, 2022 and parents are asked to download the app in preparation for the changeover.

The Sentral for Parents app allows families to:

- explain past and upcoming student absences
- receive sick bay notifications

- receive real-time notifications and messages from the school
- view academic reports
- view calendar events
- view school documents
- view school newsletters
- view links to URL's provided by the school
- book parent/teacher interviews

Accessing the Sentral for Parents App

1. Download the 'Sentral for Parents' app.
2. Search for Kingsgrove Public School.
3. Click Register here to register a new account.
You will receive a verification email which **MUST** be verified in order to continue.
4. Once verified, log back into the app and enter the following access key:
"Your child's unique key" to add your child(ren).

The books span a wide range of children's reading levels and interests and they are inexpensive (some books cost as little as \$2.00).

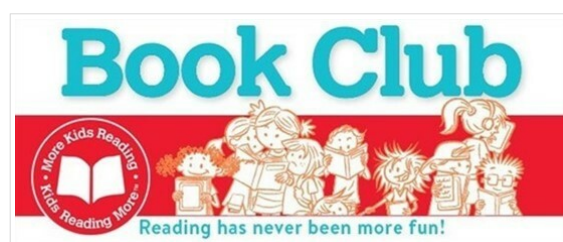
